### Diverse Populations

This table lists measure that require demonstration that the health department operates within the context of its population’s diversity.

Measure Number	Description
<u>1.1.1 T/L</u>	1. Participation of representatives from a variety of sectors from the community (in the CHA process). Within the documentation guidance: <i>Representation of two or more populations that are at higher health risk or have poorer health outcomes must be included.</i>
<u>1.1.2 T/L</u>	1. A local health assessment that includes: c) Description of health issues and specific descriptions of population groups with particular health issues and inequities; d) Description of factors that contribute to specific populations’ health challenges.
<u>3.1.3 A</u>	Efforts to specifically address factors that contribute to specific populations’ higher health risks and poorer health outcomes. The <b>purpose</b> of this measure is to assess the health department’s assessment, identification, and efforts to address factors that contribute to specific populations’ higher health risks and poorer health outcomes, or health inequities.

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<b>5.2.2 L</b>	From the guidance from 1a: The CHIP must <i>include consideration of addressing social determinants of health, causes of higher health risks and poorer health outcomes of specific populations, and health inequities.</i>
<b>5.4.2 A</b>	The Emergency Operations Plan (EOP) must, according to PHAB’s guidance, <i>address emergency operations for the entire population (including special needs and vulnerable populations, e.g., those with disabilities and non-English speaking people).</i>
<b>7.1.2 A</b>	Measure 7.1.2 A (Identification of populations who experience barriers to health care services identified) requires 1) A process for the identification of un-served or under-served populations and 2) A report that identifies populations who are un-served or under-served
<b>7.2.3 A</b>	Measure 7.2.3 A (Implemented culturally competent initiatives to increase access to health care services for those who may experience barriers to care due to cultural, language, or literacy differences) requires documentation of 1) Initiatives to ensure that access and barriers are addressed in a culturally competent manner.
<b>11.1.4 A</b>	Measure 11.1.4 A (Policies, processes, programs, and interventions provided that are socially, culturally, and linguistically appropriate to specific populations with higher health risks and poorer health outcomes) has four components which are required to meet its purpose.

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### Governing Entities

**Domain 12: Maintain capacity to engage the public health governing entity** includes specific information that the health department is required to convey to their governing body. Moreover, several measures in other domains provide examples of information that could be shared with governing entities. It is possible that documentation for the following measures could be used toward the requirements in 12.3.1 A:

Measure Number	Description
<b>1.3.1 A</b>	2. Meetings to review and discuss selected data reports (can include meetings with governing bodies).
<b>1.4.2 T/L</b>	2. The distribution of health profiles to public health system partners, community groups and key stakeholders such as governing entities or community advisory groups, via email and websites, etc.
<b>5.1.3 A</b>	1. Information provided to policy makers and/or the public about potential public health impacts of policies that are being considered or are in place.
<b>6.1.2 A</b>	1. The provision of written recommendations to governing entity and/or elected/appointed officials concerning amendments or updates to current laws and/or proposed new laws.
<b>9.1.1 A</b>	1. Health department leadership and management supportive and engaged in establishing and/or updating a performance management system (can include presentations to governing entities).
<b>10.2.3 A</b>	1. The communication of research findings and their public health implications to stakeholders, public health system partners, and/or the public (including governing entities)

Other measures related to governing entity include the following:

Measure Number	Description
<b>3.2.3 A</b>	Requires responsibilities/expectations for individuals who will be interacting with the public and/or media (including governing entity).
<b>4.2.2 A</b>	Requires engagement of the governing entity, advisory boards, and/or elected officials about policies and/or strategies that will promote the public's health.
<b>5.1.1 A</b>	Requires documentation of monitoring/tracking public health policies under consideration by the governing entity, individuals, and/or other entities that set public health policies and practices.
<b>5.3.1 A</b>	Requires participation of the governing entity in the local health department strategic planning process.

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### Public Health Laws

**Domain 6: Enforce Public Health Laws** addresses health departments’ roles with respect to the law.

The following measures also relate to public health law:

Measure No.	Description
<b>2.1.5 A</b>	2. The department must provide a copy of laws relating to the reporting of notifiable/reportable diseases. This can be a hard copy or a link to an electronic version. This can include a posting on a website or a department intranet, or a link to another website.
<b>3.2.5 A</b>	1. The health department must provide documentation of a website that provides, among other items, links to public health related laws
<b>12.1.1 A</b>	1. The health department must provide a copy of the body of law (statutes, rules, regulations, ordinances) that sets forth its mandated public health operations, programs, and services or a listing of mandated public health services and the reference to the legal citation. The health department must have copies or access to the laws and regulations available to the site visit team. Examples include: mandated vaccinations; mandated oversight of environmental public health conditions, such as solid waste, small public water systems, underground storage tanks, and hazardous materials; and various inspection programs, such as restaurant inspections.
