 - Clergy?
 - · Civic groups?
 - Social service agencies?
 - Advocacy groups?

Strategies for involving residents

PHAB Guidance:

- publication of findings in local press with feedback forms
- publication on the LHDs web page
- community forums
- listening sessions
- newsletters
- presentations at other organizations' meetings

Role of Board of Health

PHAB Guidance:

The governing entity should be knowledgeable about the health department's overall assessment and quality improvement initiatives. The governing entity will be in a better position to guide, advocate for, and engage with the health department if they are aware of improvements being undertaken.

Functions of a board in support of assessments and accreditation

- Be Informed, monitor and digest
- Include costs in budget & support before Commission and Council, etc.
- Participate in CHA, CHIP
- Participate in Agency Plan, monitor and support
